

Library Corner


The Annual Holiday Bazaar, sponsored by the Library, is this Saturday! November 30. This much anticipated community event is your chance to see friends, buy


food goodies, crafts and other curated items. It is always a highlight of the Holiday Season!!!

Ann Moxey has long taught yoga at prisons throughout Mexico and even the United States. This past week she invited several of her yoga students to go with her for her weekly yoga class at the Juvenile Prison near Xochicalco. Judy Frothingham, Chris Jones and Cecilia Sanchez donned the red shirts and jeans (required uniform for visitors) and joined the nearly

100 young people for a long afternoon. At Current Events last Wednesday Chris and Cecilia gave a long, very positive report on what they had seen and the desperate educational (among other) needs of these young people. Ann and the three visitors brainstormed about how we can best help these young people turn their lives around and have a new start when they are released. For example, there are lots of guitars but no guitar strings or teacher. There are willing brains to learn but few books and fewer teachers. Youngsters receive very few family visits and are totally dependent on others for toiletries, etc. This is a potential major outreach program for Saint Michael's and will be discussed at the Annual Meeting in January. Stay tuned.
